## MIND MATTERS

ental health problems are on the rise. According to WHO, depression is the third most common condition in the

world after cancer and heart disease, and it is slated to become the number one medical disorder by 2030. Consequently, the need for mental health professionals, especially psychiatrists, is enormous.

Anecdotal reports suggest there are about 3,000-5,000 registered psychiatrists in India for the country's 1.2 billion population. This means that there is one psychiatrist per 3,00,000 people. This is a significantly low ratio. What is even more surprising is that the number of registered psychiatrists in the country India is only half the number of psychiatrists of Indian origin practicing in the USA. Given the mismatch between demand

and supply, psychiatry will be (perhaps

already is) a sought after specialty.

This is evident from the increasing number of individuals seeking help not just for illnesses but also mental wellness, coherence, harmonisation and reconnecting with life. Positive contributors include worldwide antistigma and educational campaign and the so-called 'reverse brain' drain with highly trained psychiatrists from abroad returning to India and offering high quality personcentred care.

Psychiatry is an emerging field in India. There have been calls to make it a separate subject in the MBBS curriculum with emphasis on formal introduction of mental health and behavioural science to student. This is a positive step forward since it will enable early learning of empathy and effective communication skills, and introduce better understanding of human suffering. More importantly, it may further improve recruitment and retention in this speciality.

### **INDSUTRY OVERVIEW**

Psychiatry is a wonderful combination of science and art (the art of life). It is one of the most interesting, innovative, stimulating

and rewarding specialities of medicine. This field can help improve awareness about self, people and life in general.

At its core, psychiatry adopts a holistic approach in treating a person by focussing on the mind (conscious unconscious thoughts), body, feelings and emotional reactions, and the interconnectedness of an individual and the world around.

Additionally, the working hours can be flexible with minimal emergency and night shifts, making it an attractive option for female doctors and doctors with families.

### TRAINING PATHWAYS

In order to train in psychiatry, one must have an MBBS degree. Aspirants can consider opting for a relevant internship as part of their one-year compulsory rotatory internship programme. Typically, an individual has to appear for competitive exams to enter postgraduate training in psychiatry (MD or MRCPsych UK). On the completion of a master's degree graduates can begin work as senior resident in a specific specialty and/or pursue higher specialist training in areas of interest such a general psychiatry, de-addiction, child psychiatry, geriatric psychiatry and psychotherapy. Alongside, some may pursue additional qualification in management, teaching and research as well.

### **SCOPE OF WORK**

A psychiatrist can work across medical institutions/ colleges as a teacher while practising and conducting research; work in the private sector like a corporate hospital, clinic and/ or rehabilitation centres; research and development work in a pharmaceutical company; medico-legal work with the police, prosecution service, prison and courts giving advice on disposal of convicts suspected or deemed to be suffering from mental disorders; consulting at schools; life coaching and guidance via

had a difficult task of convincing my parents to allow me to move from Mumbai to Bangalore to pursue a course in Bachelors of ayurvedic medicine and sur-

Ayurveda does involve surgery, which surprises many people. Ayurveda is not merely homemade remedies; neither does it limit itself to only symptomatic treatment. It is a complete science in itself

which holds good for curing diseases in the 'dis-eased' and

also preserving health in the healthy. The reason I chose this field is because of an exposure to Ayurvedic medicines at home and a general curiosity about the science.

Currently I am in my second year and the course duration is five and a half years at Sri Sri College of

Ayurvedic Science. The subjects we study include the anatomy (along with cadaver dissection) and physiology in its Ayurvedic as well as modern perspective, subjects relating to drug preparation, their qualities, drugs of metallic origin, pathology, preventive medicine, toxicology with forensic science to name a few and many more clinically related subjects, which will be taught in the next few years. And for all these subjects we learn both the Ayurvedic as well as the modern medicinal dimension. This makes it interesting indeed, acknowledging the authenticity of

The main basis of Ayurveda is the ancient texts --- Charaka Samhita --relating to general medicine and Sushruta Samhita --- relating to surgery written in Sanskrit. These San-

Ayurveda with its modern co-rela-

skrit texts written centuries ago are still relevant today. Professors in our college create a conducive atmosphere for us to learn the science. The diagnosis and treatment in Ayurveda are accurate and based on a patient's body type (Prakruti), whether Vata, Pitta or Kapha. We are taught to diagnose a disease and treat them keeping these concepts in mind. We find a lot of chronic diseases managed by these concepts in our clinical bedside examination classes where we study patients in detail with their disease history and prognosis in our hospital.

Thus, studying this 'science of life' has been the best thing to have happened to me. I plan to pursue a post-graduation and then open my own practice.

What is the role of higher education in fostering world-changing innova-



"At NOLS, we deem any context that is an hour away from formal medical care as wilderness. You learn to use a first aid kit in conjunction with improvised care using available resources, for in wilderness you don't have a hospital at hand. 
